ABOUT OUR CAMPS

Age Appropriate Camps

Each camp is designed for a particular age group and programs are broken down by age, not by grade. Units are based on the number of campers in each age group, not on units from the previous summer. Participation in the elementary school camps is based on age as of September 1, 2018. Participation in the middle school camps is based on age as of September 30, 2018. Camps are comprised of units of approximately 20 campers. Each unit is supervised by a Senior Counselor, who is at least a high school graduate, and a Junior Counselor, who has completed at least tenth grade. All camp sites have a Team Leader and one or two Assistant Team Leaders. These positions are normally filled by teachers or college-age students.

Meal Program

Campers should bring a lunch and beverage daily. Breakfast and/or lunches will be provided by Montgomery County Food and Nutrition Services at selected FARMS camp sites when eligible.

Field Trips

Your camp registration fee covers the cost of all field trips. No additional fees are required for your child to participate. Transportation for all field trips will be provided by the City of Gaithersburg or Montgomery County Public School buses and/or vans.

Air Conditioning

The City requests air conditioning at all sites where available. Please note, however, that most of the gymnasiums in use by our programs do not have air conditioning.

Extreme Heat Plan Guidelines

Programs will limit outdoor activity and may provide alternative activities when code red and high temperature alerts are issued. However activities will still be held outdoors for short periods of time.

Emergency Cancellations

For information regarding delays and closures of MCPS facilities, visit **www.montgomeryschoolsmd.org**. Please check the City's website at **www.gaithersburgmd.gov** for up-to-date information regarding emergency program cancellations in City facilities.

Behavior Policy

Appropriate behavior by participants is expected at all times. All campers will be asked to sign a Character Agreement detailing the guidelines for behavior and responsibility. The staff will work cooperatively with parents to keep them informed of inappropriate behavior and solicit their support to resolve conflicts and encourage positive interaction. Participants who remain disruptive after consultation with the parents may be dismissed from the program.

Late Pickup Penalty

A late fee of \$3 per every 10 minutes per child will be charged to parents who arrive late to pick up their children. Payment is due upon arrival and a child may not participate again until the late fee has been paid.

SOBRE NUESTROS CAMPAMENTOS

Edades apropiadas para campamentos

Cada campamento es designado por un grupo de edades en particular; y los programas son divididos por edades, no por grados. Las unidades son basadas por los números de campistas en cada grupo de edad, no en unidades del mismo verano anterior. La participación para los campamentos de las escuelas elemental es basado en las edades hasta el 1ero de Septiembre, 2018. La participación para los campamentos de las escuelas primaria es basado en las edades hasta el 30 de septiembre, 2018. Los campamentos son comprendidos por aproximadamente 20 campistas por unidad. Cada unidad es supervisada por un consejero mayor, quien es mínimo graduado(a) de la secundaria, y un consejero junior, quien ha por lo menos completado el grado 10. Todas las localidades de los campamentos tienen un líder o uno o dos lideres asistentes. Estas posiciones son normalmente ocupadas por profesores o estudiantes de universidad.

Programa de comida

Los campistas deberán traer consigo mismos su almuerzo y sus bebidas diarias. Ciertas localidades de campamentos ofrecerán desayuno y almuerzo, que son proveídos por el departamento de servicio de comida de Montgomery County.

Paseos/viajes

El pago de la registración del campamento cubre los costos de todos los viajes o paseos. Ningún pago adicional es requerido por su niño(a) para participar salvo que sea lo contrario. La transportación para todos los viajes o paseos serán provistas por la ciudad de Gaithersburg o los buses de las escuelas públicas del condado de Montgomery.

Aire acondicionado

La ciudad solicita aire acondicionado en todas las localidades donde estén disponibles. Por favor, note que, sin embargo, en la mayoría de los gimnasios en uso por nuestros programas no tienen aire acondicionado.

Plan para el calor extremo

Los programas limitaran las actividades al aire libre y tendrán actividades alternativas cuando las alertas de código rojo y temperaturas altas sean emitidas. Sin embargo, las actividades serán por periodos cortos al aire libre.

Póliza de comportamiento

Comportamientos apropiados por los participantes es esperado en todo momento. Todos los campistas serán cuestionados a firmar un acuerdo de carácter detallando las pautas de comportamiento y responsabilidades. Los empleados trabajaran cooperativamente con los padres para mantenerlos informados de comportamientos inapropiados y solicitar de su apoyo para resolver estos conflictos y motivar interacción positiva. Todos los participantes quienes permanezcan disruptivos después de consultar con los padres serán despedidos del programa.

Multa por recoger tarde

Una multa de \$3 por cada 10 minutos de retraso por niño(a) será cobrado a los padres que lleguen tarde a recoger a sus niños(a). Los pagos se deben cancelar a la llegada de los padres al recoger sus niños; y el niño(a) no podrá participar nuevamente hasta que la multa haya sido pagado.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Q. My child will be the correct age for the camp by September 1, 2018, but not by the first day of camp which starts in June. Can she still register?
- A. Yes, you may register your child for most of our programs as long as she/he is the correct age by September 1, 2018 the deadline set by MCPS. If your child is not the stated age by the first day of camp in June, but will be by September 1, she/he is eligible to register. If your child turns the correct age no later than a week after the cut off, you may send a written request to override the registration to the site supervisor for that program. The supervisor will make determinations on a case by case basis.
- Q. Are units divided by grade or by age? My son and his best friend want to be in the same unit together, but one is 7 and one is 8 years old.
- A. Units are made by age, not by grade. They are based off of a 1:10 staff to child ratio and depend on the number of children in each age bracket. For example, if one site has more 8 year olds than 7 year olds, the 8 year olds could end up in Unit 2 instead of Unit 3 at another site. If you would like your son and his friend to be in the same unit, please contact the site supervisor about two weeks before camp starts to make the request. Please note that we try to accommodate all requests, but the safety of our participants and the ratios of staff to campers are our priority. Please see the top of page 3 for more information on age appropriate camps.

- Q. What is the staffing structure of your camps?
- A. Each site will have 2-3 Team Leaders who are in or have graduated college. Each unit will have two counselors, one being at least a Senior Counselor. A Senior Counselor is a staff member who has graduated high school or is at least 18 years old. The second counselor could be a Junior Counselor who is still in high school. All our paid staff have been fingerprinted and received background checks with the FBI. They have also undergone a background check with Child Protective Services, per Maryland State Law.
- Q. Will breakfast and/or lunch be provided?
- A. Campers should bring a lunch and beverage daily that does not need refrigeration. Montgomery County Food and Nutrition Services will provide breakfast and lunch daily at select sites if campers choose to have pre-prepared meals. Sites with food service will be determined in May 2018.
- Q. How do you determine if my child is a swimmer or a nonswimmer and does my child have to pass a swim test?
- A. Non-swimmers are indicated as such on the consent form by the parent. If you designate your child as a non-swimmer, the staff will have them them wear a wrist band and your child will be restricted to chest-deep water in a roped off section of the pool. If your child is not indicated as a non-swimmer, they will have full access to all water depths and slides for which they meet the proper height requirement. Summer Camp staff do not offer swim tests or swimming lessons through camp, but parents can register for swim lessons directly through the Aquatics Department.

PRESCHOOL CAMPS

PRE-K TOT TIME

Ages 3 – 4 as of December 31, 2017

Summer Pre-K classes are for children 3-4 years old as of December 31, 2017. The Pre-K Tot Time program provides a warm environment where learning is fun. Learning is done through story time, music time and arts and crafts. Children will experience science, language arts and math while growing necessary social skills. Classes meet twice a week for 6 weeks. Fees are due in full at time of registration.

INCLUSION PROGRAM



SUMMER CAMP REQUIRED FORMS

CAMP CONSENT FORM

This form contains essential information regarding emergency contacts and release authorization.

CHARACTER AGREEMENT

This agreement explains to parents and children the department's guidelines on behavior and responsibility. Please take the time to help your child read and understand the agreement.

MEDICATION FORM

This form is required if your child must administer his or her own medication during the camp day. We MUST have this form signed by a doctor before we can hold any medication for your child, including any prescription or over-the-counter medicines. Medications must be in the original container with instructions for use and/or in a container labeled by the prescriber/pharmacist. If you do not need this form at this time, please keep it in the event the need arises during the camp session.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE

City of Gaithersburg residents may apply for financial assistance for eligible summer programs. Applications must be submitted and approved <u>before registration</u>. If approved, applicants will receive a discount ranging from 10%-90% of each eligible program. Early registrants may request a payment plan for camp programs.

Financial aid recipients who elect the payment plan option for camp programs must pay the remaining balance, not covered by financial assistance, in accordance with the published payment plan. Balances must be paid in full by the date stated in the payment plan. For all other programs, any amount not covered by financial assistance must be paid at the time of registration.
